




Fig 1. Continuous drain current as a function of mounting base temperature





Fig 2. Normalized total power dissipation as a function of mounting base temperature





**Fig 4. Transient thermal impedance from junction to mounting base as a function of pulse duration**







Fig 5. Forward transconductance as a function of drain current; typical values





Fig 6. Transfer characteristics: drain current as a function of gate-source voltage; typical values





Fig 7. Input and reverse transfer capacitances as a function of gate-source voltage; typical values




Fig 8. Drain-source on-state resistance as a function of gate-source voltage; typical values




**Fig 9. Output characteristics: drain current as a function of drain-source voltage; typical values**




**Fig 10. Gate-source threshold voltage as a function of junction temperature**



**Fig 11. Sub-threshold drain current as a function of gate-source voltage**




**Fig 12. Normalized drain-source on-state resistance factor as a function of junction temperature**



**Fig 13. Drain-source on-state resistance as a function of drain current; typical values**




**Fig 14. Gate charge waveform definitions**





**Fig 16. Input, output and reverse transfer capacitances as a function of drain-source voltage; typical values**




