1.1 General description

SiliconMAX standard level N-channel enhancement mode Field-Effect Transistor (FET) in a plastic package using TrenchMOS technology. This product is designed and qualified for use in computing, communications, consumer and industrial applications only.











Fig 4. Transient thermal impedance from junction to mounting base as a function of pulse duration





Fig 5. Sub-threshold drain current as a function of gate-source voltage





Fig 6. Output characteristics: drain current as a function of drain-source voltage; typical values





Fig 7. Transfer characteristics: drain current as a function of gate-source voltage; typical values





Fig 8. Forward transconductance as a function of drain current; typical values





Fig 9. Gate-source threshold voltage as a function of junction temperature





Fig 10. Drain-source on-state resistance as a function of drain current; typical values





Fig 11. Normalized drain-source on-state resistance factor as a function of junction temperature








Fig 15. Package outline SOT428 (DPAK)
