Product data sheet

1. General description

Planar passivated high commutation three quadrant triac in a SOT78 (TO-220AB) plastic package intended for use in circuits where high static and dynamic dV/dt and high dI/dt can occur. This "series CT" triac will commutate the full RMS current at the maximum rated junction temperature ($T_{j(max)} = 150~{\rm ^{\circ}C}$) without the aid of a snubber. It is used in applications where "high junction operating temperature capability" is required.




Fig. 1. RMS on-state current as a function of mounting base temperature; maximum values




Fig. 2. RMS on-state current as a function of surge duration; maximum values




Fig. 3. Total power dissipation as a function of RMS on-state current; maximum values





Fig. 4. Non-repetitive peak on-state current as a function of the number of sinusoidal current cycles; maximum values




(1) dl_T/dt limit Fig. 5. Non-repetitive peak on-state current as a function of pulse duration; maximum values


- (1) Unidirectional (half cycle)

Fig. 7. Normalized gate trigger current as a function of junction temperature




Fig. 8. Normalized latching current as a function of junction temperature





Fig. 9. Normalized holding current as a function of junction temperature







Fig. 10. On-state current as a function of on-state voltage






